LITCHFIELD, CT - The Litchfield Land Trust, in partnership with the Daughters of Wisdom and Wisdom House, signed a Land Conservation Easement agreement on February 10, 2020 at Wisdom House Retreat and Conference Center.

This agreement assures the protection of 54.4 acres, retained forever in their natural, scenic and open space condition, protecting rare plants, water and animals in the protected land.

The possibility of a Conservation Easement agreement at Wisdom House has been eight years in study & planning. This project has been spearheaded by the former Executive Director of Wisdom House, Sister Rosemarie Greco, DW, and Dr. John Fulkerson, Litchfield Land Trust Emeritus Board member.
