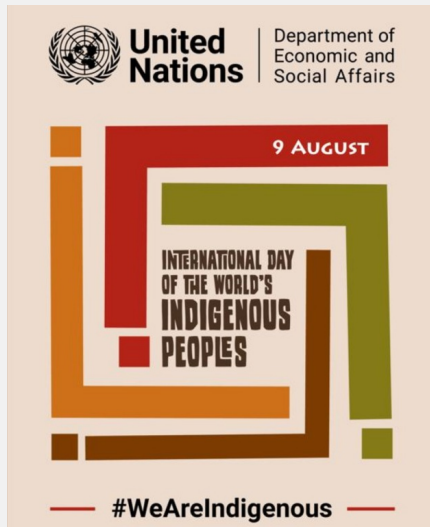




August 9th is Indigenous Peoples' Day

August 9 is celebrated as International Indigenous Peoples' Day. The 2022 theme is the "Role of Indigenous Women in the Preservation and Transmission of Traditional Knowledge." According to the United Nations and UNESCO, women have transmitted "ancestral knowledge of communal activities as well as effective climate solutions, use of natural resources, protection of biodiversity, ensuring food security, promoting native languages and culture and managing indigenous science and medicine." Without doubt, we support these values.

Here, in Litchfield, the Land Trust acknowledges that we live on the Indigenous Tribal homeland of the Pootatuck and Weatinock Peoples whose descendents are the modern day Schaghticoke people. A small portion of the Tunxis homeland can also be found in Litchfield.

We are so fortunate for this land and we carry the responsibility to Conserve and Protect it forever.
