Our gratitude extends to Barbara Katzin, Willie Katzin, Anne R. Hackney, Jim Katzin, Louise Katzin and Charlotte Katzin. They are the owners of the property that was purchased in the 1950s by their father. Jim says, “when six people jointly own property and have no intention of developing it, it is better to let the Land Trust protect it, than for it to get further diluted in the next generation”. For the family members to reach a consensus on gifting the land was an easy conversation.
